ABOUT THE FELLOWSHIP

The Scottish Fellowship of Christian Writers was founded in 1980. Members range from those who write for their pleasure alone, through those who aspire to be published and those who are making their way in that direction, to some who have several books to their names.

WHAT IS THE AIM OF THE FELLOWSHIP?

The Fellowship aims to promote the writing of good wholesome literature, both Christian and secular, and to encourage members in their writing.



WHO CAN JOIN?

Members are committed Christians who accept Almighty God as the creator and sustainer of all things, his Son, Jesus Christ, as the one and only Redeemer of his people, the Holy Spirit as guide and comforter, and the Bible as God's inspired Word.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

The annual subscription is £12. It is due in September each year and should be paid by Standing Order if possible. Joint membership is £18 per year.

SFCW CONFERENCES

These are held in Compton Baptist Church Hall, Stirling, from 10 am till 3.30 pm on the second Saturdays of May and November. Tea and coffee are provided, but members bring a packed lunch. There is a shop nearby.

A guest speaker is usually invited to address the morning session on some aspect of writing. Speakers have included authors, editors, poets, journalists, those involved in the dramatic arts and a publisher. The afternoons are normally taken up with workshops led by members. Both poetry and prose workshops are normally on offer at each Conference. Conference fee - £8.
